time to save the forests is the reluctance of a few developing nations to co-operate with what they see as efforts by wealthy countries to restrict resource development in poorer regions. A recent study on the condition of European forests found that, out of those trees that were examined, one quarter was found to be losing their leaves while ten percent suffered from significant leaf discoloration. These findings have led researchers to believe that one in every four trees in the European forests is sick or dying.

5 Among the chief culprits responsible for the death and deterioration of Europe's forests are pollutants such as sulphur dioxide and nitrogen oxide. These pollutants can be found in car exhausts and industrial emissions, and they can cause acid rain. Measures taken to reduce emission quantity per car have proven to be futile because the number of cars itself has grown. While some countries have drastically reduced their release of sulphur dioxide, not all have followed suit. As such, their efforts are rendered inconsequential by comparison. Some countries have taken action to heal the scars of logging only under calls of international pressure. In the case of a few others, no amount of force seems to have an effect on them. Many countries' government and large companies have turned their once vast and unspoiled rainforests into money machines.
